Officer Justin Ellis sustained serious internal injuries as a result of this accident, and is about to undergo surgery to his neck and spine. He may not walk again. He is married, and has two children.

On Monday, October 10th DART Police Officer Justin Ellis was seriously injured in an on-duty motorcycle crash while responding to a police service call. As a result of the crash Officer Ellis suffered major life threatening injuries. Officer Ellis is fighting for his life. The Dallas Baylor medical team attending to him is doing everything that they can to help him survive.

Officer Ellis is lucky to be alive and about to undergo surgery to his neck and spine. He will be lucky to be able to walk again. Due to the accident, he is on workmen's compensation and his family is only receiving 67% of his pay. His wife has to send checks to DART every month to keep him and his family covered under his medical insurance policy.

DALLAS - A Dallas Area Rapid Transit officer was injured while on duty Monday night.

Officer Justin Ellis was seriously injured when a driver ran a red light and hit his motorcycle on Scyene Road near Fair Park in Dallas.

DART said Ellis suffered several broken bones and internal injuries. According to a Facebook post by the Rockwall Police Department, he is in now intensive care after several surgeries.

“We ask that you keep Officer Ellis and his family in your thoughts and prayers as he recovers. This will be a long and tedious process for Officer Ellis and his family but we want them to know that we are here to help in any way needed,” the department said.

Ellis and his family are close friends with several Rockwall police officers.

The Assist The Officer Foundation provides financial assistance to officers who are facing the loss of income due to a serious injury, life-threatening illness or other catastrophic event. Immediate assistance is also available to an officer's family in the event of the death of an active officer.

Since its creation in 1999, the foundation has provided assistance to hundreds of officers and their families who were faced with any number of different life-altering situations.

Growing and Changing

In 2004, the ATO Foundation launched a first of its kind, confidential counseling service, exclusively for Dallas police officers. The stress of everyday life can take a toll on almost anyone – add to that, the danger and stress of being a police officer – and sometimes life can be overwhelming. Our counseling program was designed for police officers, by police officers and professionals working together.

As resources allow, the Foundation will continue its growth by adding new programs to meet the needs of police officers in an ever-changing world.

Our Leadership



Frederick Frazier, Chairman. Frederick is a 21-year veteran with the Dallas Police Department and is currently Chairman of The Assist the Officer Foundation (ATO). Outside of his full time position with the police department, Frederick dedicates his time in helping ATO with their day to day operations, fundraising, marketing and networking to increase public awareness of the organization. As an experienced officer, he has witnessed first-hand the dangers that surround his co-workers. His message to the community focuses on how ATO symbolizes the appreciation for every officer's dedicated service and commitment to the safety of citizens. Frederick is also the 1st Vice President of the Dallas Police Association, providing leadership, and assistance in labor related issues to his members.

Honoring Our Founders



William James "Bill" Carollo, co-founder. Officer Carollo served as Vice President of the *Dallas Police Association* and was instrumental in establishing the *Assist the Officer Foundation*. An 18-year veteran of the Dallas Police Department, Officer Carollo was killed in a head-on car wreck as a result of a drunk driver on April 5, 2003 at the age of 46. His passing was a tragic loss to his family, his fellow officers and the entire community, and his legacy of heroic dedication to his duty and commitment to others will

continue to be a source of inspiration for the countless people whose lives he touched.



David Rodriguez, co-founder. In 1994, David Rodriguez's life changed forever. David was a Dallas Police Detective, who on that fateful January day, was shot and paralyzed from the waist down running a drug warrant. After a lengthy period of rehabilitation, David found himself unable to perform his duties and was forced to retire.

David did retire – but he didn't stop working. He recognized the need to help his fellow officers who found themselves in similar circumstances and helped create the Assist the Officer Foundation. Through David's efforts, Dallas police officers can get much needed assistance when faced with catastrophic injury or illness.



Eddie Crawford, co-founder. Eddie joined the Dallas Police Department in 1977 and served as a DPA Vice president since 1988 before his retirement from the Department in the summer of 2011. Eddie is an original ATO board member since its 1999 creation. "As with any great tragedy opportunity follows. Through David Rodriguez's horrible injury we were able to discover an opportunity to provide necessary scaffolding to officers and their families during times of need. The formation of ATO was an opportunity to create a legacy that will outlive us all. Every time ATO has the opportunity to provide the assistance these officers deserve we ensure that David's sacrifice, like so many others, will never be forgotten. I am honored to have been a part of this awesome collaboration with my friends and colleagues."



Thomas Popken, co-founder. Detective Popken is one of the original and founding board members of the ATO. While serving as the Vice President of the Dallas Police Association, Tom was approached by Bill Carollo and David Rodriguez with the concept for the foundation. Recognizing the needs for officers seeking assistance, Tom immediately joined the efforts of his colleagues to help create the organization. Later, when Officer Carollo was killed, Detective Popken took over as the new Chairman of ATO—serving as the Chairman from 2003 to 2009. "Our goal as founding staff and board members is to ensure the organization survives beyond any of us". Tom Popken retired from the Department in the summer of 2013 and is enjoying his retirement in the Centennial State.

Honorary Members



Christopher Kevin James is the only sitting board member of the Dallas Police Association (DPA) to be killed in the line of duty—he was shot outside of a nightclub while working as a uniformed off-duty officer. Kevin was a Board Member of the DPA when Assist the Officer Foundation was developed. Kevin's tragic death is a constant reminder to us, and to those we seek donations from, of the dangers officers face every day. In November of 2007, the DPA and ATO Board of Directors launched the Kevin James Endowment Fund to honor the memory of their friend and fellow officer. OFFICE	RESPONSIBILITY	RESPONSIBILITIES OF OFFICE
President	(candidate must have previously held a position on the board)	Chairperson of the Board of Directors; Presides at all meetings of the association and the Board of Directors; Ex-Officio member of all committees. Responsible for approving or submitting articles to NADOA Magazine.
1st Vice President	Programs and Seminars	Arranges the speakers for all association meetings/programs & (Spring) seminar/workshops of association. Co-sign association checks written by Treasurer. Responsible for planning and presentation of programs for regular and special membership meetings, including speaker needs such as microphone, projector, screen, etc.
2nd Vice President	Publicity & PR	Publicity and newsletter of the association. Responsible for distribution of the newsletter and any other publicity for the association.
3rd Vice President	Membership and Directory	Maintain membership records and processes membership applications for submissions to board for approval. Keeps membership list with full names and addresses; Sends out all blanket email notifications regarding meetings, etc. Responsible for the compilation, maintenance, publishing and distribution of the membership directories.
Recording Secretary	Records & Meeting Minutes	Record meeting minutes and all vital information and discussions occurring at board and association meetings. Keeps record of attendees and dates of all regular and special meetings. Makes distribution of the minutes at the direction of the President; Keep a current list of the officers and committee chairpersons.
Corresponding Secretary	Contact and Website	Responsible for maintaining our organization's website and communicating with the webmaster. Coordinate with 1st Vice President and Director of House to update website with current meeting information.
Treasurer	Finance	Receive and account for all revenues, including dues, of the association; pay all expenses of the association and make all other authorized payments; sign checks jointly with the President and/or First Vice President; Submit a financial report for each Board Meeting and for publication in each Newsletter; prepare annual financial statements correctly reflecting the financial condition of the association.
Two (2) Directors-Hospitality	Hospitality	Maintains members' reservations (RSVP's) for regular & special meetings. Responsible for the reception of guests at membership meetings. Collection of attendance fees and selling raffle tickets at each meeting. Sends out thank you notes to speakers, etc. Plan and arrange activities for the promotion of fellowship among members, including but not limited to raffle and door prizes.
Director - Scholarship	Scholarship	Serves as chairman of the Scholarship Committee. Solicits and receives applications; is the liaison between the Board, applicants and review committee.
Director-Historian	Historian	Responsible for maintaining the history of the association. Presents the gift of a scrapbook to the outgoing president with memories of their years in office.
Director- House	House	Obtain suitable meeting places and makes all necessary arrangements for regular or special meetings; responsible for preparation of meeting notices and forwards same to corresponding secretary for distribution by blast email. Assists First VP with non speaker details for Spring Seminar.
Board Advisor (Previous year's President - Benevolence)	Benevolence & Nominating	Submits events and for benevolence. Chairman of the Nominating Committee and oversees the process for the election of Board of Directors in November and December. Officially notifies association of election results.
Parliamentarian and Director - Compliance	Compliance	Ensure meeting protocol follows Roberts Rules of Order Newly Revised; has custody of by-laws and will oversee any bylaw revisions; oversees annual audit.
